Overall Liverpool Art Society (LAS) has had a very good year. Our membership has stayed steady, and we are attracting new members, especially in the ceramics group.

The 24th Annual Exhibition, which also marked the 25th Anniversary of Liverpool Art Society was launched in August 2022 and was a resounding success.

We owe Pamela Rodoreda a great deal of gratitude for stepping up and coordinating the exhibition once again. Pamela was assisted by Anne Picalovski and I but the lion share of work was carried out by Pamela herself.

As it turned out, the president didn't make it to the exhibition.... due to a close family member contracting Covid. Di Hallinan was asked to stand in for the president with only a day or so to prepare; ever the professional, Di was unfazed and did a great job.

The exhibition entries were of a very high standard and the overall winner was a Mixed Media piece by Shazia Fazal titled "Painting Can Be Fun". Congratulations of course to all the winners and all who entered. Every piece hung in the iconic Casula Powerhouse Arts Gallery (CPAC) was indeed, exhibition worthy. Our thanks to the Staff of CPAC and our generous Sponsors.

Our social Co-ordinators, Jenny Phillips & Anne Picalovski organised our hugely successful Christmas Luncheon @ The Cabramatta Bowling Club, which included the "Old master's Competition" early December 2022. We were able to subsidise the Christmas Luncheon by 50% for all the attending members plus one guest per attending member.

Jenny and Anne decorated the Christmas tables, played festive music, and arranged a stack of small giveaway prizes to go to the clever members who could answer Linda Ferlazzo's art questions, correctly. The Old master's Comp was won by Christ Wellington, Vicki Wacca & your president, in that order.

At the end of March, the 23rd to be precise which also happened to be the NSW State Election Day, Liverpool Art Society ran its first Promotional Market Stall, thanks to Anne Picalovski securing the stall free of charge for us at the Liverpool Growers' and Foodies Market in Chipping Norton.

The stall was run by Anne Picalovski and Jenny Phillip. Jenny and Anne carted all the artwork, mainly from the Thursday Mixed Media/Painting Group and set up the stall. I went along for support.

Several members popped in to say 'Hi', making our stall look very busy. All in all, it was a rewarding exercise and a lot of fun. We managed to sell a few artworks and promote Liverpool Art Society to market goers. Incidentally Anne has managed a to secure a second 'free' stall for LAS sometime this year.

Jenny Phillips & Anne Picalovski hosted their 2nd ARTy pARTy last month, July 2022 which was well attended and enjoyed by all who attended.

Jenny managed to secure the venue (at Cabramatta Bowling Club) free of charge for us; we only needed to pay for the laundering of the tablecloths. Anne organised a cake for dessert, and I ran a short trivia comp.

The entries were of a high standard (as usual from LAS artists). Chris Wellington took out first prize and Anne Picalovski & Monica Salinas tied in second place.

Recently the widower of Gil Farla, Nicolas contacted Di Hallinan to donated late wife's art supplies and three of her watercolour pieces. A decision was made to use one of the Gil's watercolour pieces as a raffle prize at the ARTy pARTy.

Gil was a close friend of many of the longer serving committee members and group facilitators, and as fate would have it, Gil's watercolour was won by a member who was also a close friend of Gils, Cathy Prizeman. The Demonstration Coordinator, John Tregoning managed to secure some very interesting guest artists for the society's bi-monthly Demonstrations throughout the year, which were fairly-well attended and enjoyed by the members who went along. Following each Demonstration, John promptly penned a report for inclusion in the LAS Newsletter.

Once the Newsletters were printed, John collected them form the printers and distributed them to various locations; in addition to taking the minutes at each meeting in his role as LAS Minutes-Secretary. Thank you for all you do John.

Rod Harris our hardworking treasurer has done a great job all year. Most members are not aware of just how much time and effort Rod puts into his role as our treasure.
