Waterscape using Water-based oils.

10:30am to 12pm.

Enjoy an exciting workshop with local artist and identity, Bob Gurney. Share in his expertise as he offers tips, tricks and techniques for using water-based oils. Water mixable oils are a great alternative to traditional oils but without chemicals and odour. They dry faster and can be quickly cleaned up using only soap and warm water.

Bob is a well-respected, multi-award-winning artist whose work is collected both in Australia and overseas by private collectors and businesses. He is known for his strong skills in painting and is often invited to do private commissions, demonstrations, and workshops for art groups and community organisations.

He teaches art locally in his Camden studio, helping students develop their skills and confidence. He has a deep passion for painting outdoors, known as "en plein air," and enjoys capturing landscapes whenever he has the chance.

New Director for the Art Gallery of NSW

The current Director, Michael Brand, is leaving after 12 years.

Following a competitive international recruitment process, Maud Page has been appointed as the new director of the Art Gallery of New South Wales. Maud is the tenth director of the Art Gallery and the first woman to hold the role in the 154-year history of the institution.

With over two decades of experience in major public art galleries, Maud is highly respected both nationally and internationally for her exceptional curatorial vision, operational expertise and breadth of experience in collections and exhibitions. Maud joined the Art Gallery in 2017 as deputy director and director of collections and has previously worked at the Queensland Art Gallery, through the development of the new Gallery of Modern Art, and as a lecturer in museum studies at the University of Sydney.

Maud has a passionate belief in the transformative power of art, and is known for her engagement with artists and her strong connections to the other cultural institutions in Sydney and across the state. She will bring all this to her new role.



CONGRATULATIONS to Hedar Abadi for gaining a Highly Commended award in the Blacktown City Art Prize 2025 with his work "Yearning for Rain," featured on the front cover. He was one of only 74 finalists. Explaining why he uses fish in his artwork, Hedar said: "... we live in a world where big fish eat little fish. ... Even with finding refuge in Australia ... I still feel a connection to the waters of my homeland (Mesopotamia) ... (as a refugee) I feel like a fish in an aquarium ... Australia is a very beautiful country, with beautiful water but I would like to swim in my water."
