The cover of this issue is a painting titled *Afghan Girl*, painted by one of our longest serving members, Lesley Dawson, Les to his friends. Les has been a member for over 20years and is now aged well into his 90's, but seldom paints these days very much.

This painting, understandably, is one of Les' favourites. He completed it a few years ago referencing renowned American

photojournalist Steve McCurry's famous photographic portrait of Sharbat Gula (then aged 12), which has come to be known as the *Afghan Girl*. Gula was an Afghan refugee in Pakistan during the Soviet - Afghan War, when *Afghan Girl* was taken in 1984, then famously appeared on the June 1985 Cover of National Geographic.

Coincidently, for the photographers among us, until the 13th of August you can see one of the most complete retrospective exhibitions of McCurry's work, featuring more than 100 large-format photographs of McCurry's most famous images, including (of course), the portrait of Sharbat Gula, known as the 'Afghan Girl' at the Walsh Bay Arts Precinct on the Sydney Harbour foreshore. But be mindful that it is a ticketed exhibition. Nevertheless, we can all enjoy Les' painting for free. A striking interpretational work, a lovely painting dear Les, thank you for sharing it with us.

Our third Demonstration this year was by Camden based artist and illustrator Belle Mitchell. Belle's demo was very well attended and enjoyed by all attending her two-hour interactive drawing & colouring session. Read John's report on page 3

Get ready, all you amazingly artists as entries open for Liverpool Art Society's 25th Annual Exhibition @ Casula Powerhouse Arts Centre 9am Monday 3rd July, online. A list of Categories and Prizes, as well as a summary of some of the main conditions of entry are included on pages...... Please make sure you read ALL the conditions of entry in-full online before entering, as this it is a condition of entry. This year we are asking that professional (or at least good amateur) photos of your artwork are included with your entry forms. Some tips on taking decent images is on page.... In addition to a photo/image of your work, a short artists statement is strongly advised, although not compulsory. An artist statement is helpful with judging; not to mention it gives your artwork a chance at being included in the exhibition's program/catalogue. Again, this is not compulsory, simply an option, but strongly encouraged! See Photo tips on page 10 which I hope will be of some use.

For anyone needing help with their entry forms a 'Help Day' will be held on Saturday 3rd September, 10am-2pm @ CPAC.

Our AGM is on Saturday 19th August @ Chipping Norton Community Centre PLEASE try and attend at least this one meeting a year.








DEMONSTRATION REPORT – June 2023 with Belle Mitchell.

On Thursday 15th June, Belle Mitchell, artist, and illustrator from Camden, introduced, many of us, to art expression using artist grade-coloured pencils. She describes the use of this medium as a 'slow' one, which uses multiple layers working from light to dark colours on a cartridge or watercolour paper which has a 'tooth' or texture to its finish. The oil or wax based, what we'd refer to as the lead, captures the pigment to then blend and build to the finished result.

Belle's preferred 'tools of trade'

- PAPER Fabriano Artistico (watercolour) cold pressed; Eckersley's or art supplier
- PENCILS Faber-Castell Polychromos these are oil based, Eckersley's or Office Works
- Prismacolor Premier these are wax based, Eckersley's or Office Works
- BLENDER Prismacolor OR Paper Stump Office Works, art supplier
- BALL END MODELLING TOOL (STYLUS)—Spotlight, art supplier, \$2 shop; OR a toothpick
- KNEADABLE ERASOR Office Works, any art supplier
- ERASOR/BATTERY POWER ERASOR any art supplier, \$2 shop.
- OR Art Spectrum Odorless Solvent



- SHADING use the side of the pencil in a circular motion with less pressure to 'fade' the colour.
- CROSS HATCHING maybe use different colours to achieve a different colour and effect.
- STIPPLING dots of, sometimes one colour over another, useful in botanical subjects
- BLENDING light base with darker colours then blended using blending tool in circular motion.



We practised these skills on a single leaf outline to which we embossed what would become the veins in the leaf with our toothpicks, before adding the first of several different colours to be blended. Then we moved onto drawing the branch of a Lilly Pilli with its little red berries. Belle guided the 19 of us through the processes of turning the feint outline into a colourful botanical work.

Some very personal interpretations were the result of this introduction to a different medium, and we thank Belle for her patient instruction in imparting some of her considerable skills using this medium. Belle

directed us to the U-Tube and Website for Lisa Lachri as a useful reference.

- Entry open to all financial Liverpool Art Society Members
- Entry Fee for Adults is \$15 per entry. Youth entries are free.
- Max. of 2 entries per member (each artwork must be on separate entry form)
- Max. Size of 2D artwork must not exceed 600cm perimeter measure in total (including frame)
 i.e., measurement of all four sides added together cannot exceed 600cm (including frame).
 For sculptures, size cannot exceed 1 cubic metre i.e.take up more than 1 metre of space in any direction.
- ° Artwork must have been completed within the last **24months** prior to entering.
- ° Adult Artwork may be for sale. Youth artwork is not for sale.
- ° Artwork priced under \$100, no commission is charged.
- ° Artwork priced \$100 or more, a commission of 20% is charged (10% CPAC, 10% LAS)
- ° Artist Statement (max, 60 words) is encouraged, to assist with judging.
- ° A good image (if possible professional on white background) is highly recommended, for judging and possible inclusion in the promotional program/catalogue.
- ° The artist is responsible for delivery and collection of artworks at the times specified.
- ° No wet paintwork will be accepted...artwork must be completely dry & ready to hang/display.
- ° The judge's decision is final.
- Reading the FULL Terms and Conditions on Entry Forms is a prerequisite of entry.

TWO CATEGORIES

1/ WALL WORKS

All mediums accepted including painting, illustration, photography, collage, printmaking and textiles. Entries must be SQUARE and meas. no bigger than 25 x 25cm. Including framing.

2/ CERAMICS

Entries must not exceed 8cm in any direction.

Ceramic works must be able to be displayed on a flat horizontal surface.

Tips for taking better images of your artwork.

Tip 1

Position the camera so it's facing the artwork head-on - the plane of the artwork should be parallel to the back of your camera, or you'll get a trapezoid instead of a square image. The artwork should fill the camera or phone viewer, to maximise the resolution of the final photo.

Tip 2

Light your work properly. If you are photographing your work indoors, make sure you do it in a room with plenty of windows and natural light. If you can, we recommend photographing your work outdoors when it is cloudy or overcast, as *indirect* sunlight provides the best lighting.

Tip 3

Edit your photograph if needed. There are plenty of free or inexpensive photo editing software programs that you can use – of course Photoshop is still the most popular. Your phone or device will also have basic functions to enable you to crop, correct colour and make other minor adjustments.

For those who enjoy taking photos on their phone or don't own a camera



Snapseed is a completely free professional photo editing app developed by Google for phones you might wish to try. Download it on your phone through the App Store. Then when you take your photos (of your artwork) using your phone (and following the tips above) you can process them on your phone using Snapseed for uploading with your entry forms. Sorry if sounds a little complicated, perhaps ask techy family members to help with taking the photos for you.

Although I am fascinated and amazed at using Watercolour, Gouache, Acrylic and even Oil painting off and on for several years and visiting numerous art exhibitions through the years locally and overseas, it is crystal clear to me that drawing is ever so important and valid today as it was for the old masters and beyond. Please don't forget drawing is the foundation of all art disciplines, whether Interior, graphic, industrial or fashion design, even architecture.

Attending an exhibition several years ago at The Art Gallery of NSW of the most celebrated Australian artist (painter) Brett Whiteley made it known that even he paid extra attention to the importance of drawing. In that show he emphasised how important drawing is in our daily life as artists and creative individuals.

Studying Klimt, Toulouse-Lautrec, Bridgman, Raphael, da Vinci, and my favourite Michelangelo has made a huge impact on my art practice. Drawing can be fun and having spoken to some of our members after the workshop, we can be easily distracted by everyday activities and simply forget to draw or sketch anything just to maintain our rhythm and ability in handling this art form.

Thanks to John for organising and Chris for assisting with this small but well-attended workshop. Chris handled the overhead projector using an iPhone which is so cool, haven't seen that approach before.

Thanks to Belle for running our LAS workshop and sharing her skills and talent, try and follow her on Instagram and have a look at her artworks and achievements.
