

#### **ANNUAL EXHIBITION 2025**




**OVERALL WINNER** – **Idil Abdullahi** – <u>Judges Comment:</u> "At first sight, "Exhale" is an abstract, unobtrusive work; but looking again it reveals itself as a deeply contemplative work, full of tradition and currency."



Idil Abdullahi, very excited that her work "Exhale" was chosen as the Overall Winner. The work consists of hand-made ceramic beads "placed with quiet intent, each a pause, a breath." Idil draws on symbols of faith and culture to examine personal ideas of identity, belonging and separation.







SCHOLARSHIP "Morning Town Hall" by Wenhan Wang.
Judge: "Morning Town Hall' is an atmospheric painting in the impressionist tradition, with movement and composition. Its chromatics capture the interplay between the city and nature. It will be fascinating to see how the artist develops their practice in the coming year."



MASTERTON PRIZE (Innovation & Technical Excellence): Charlie Roppola Wells for "Rock Hill." 2025 Acrylic.

Judge: "Rock Hill" has a sense of place and highly developed visual language that capture the memory and experience of place. The brushstrokes and application of paint reinvent a strong tradition in this field.



First Prize Oil or Encaustic "Save Our Fish From Drowning" by Hedar Abadi

Judge: A highly accomplished painting, taking us on a journey through our current condition of precarity. This appears as an allegory of Cericault's "The Raft of the Meduca"

Charlie will be demonstrating her unique contemporary style - in acrylic.

Charlie graduated from the University of Western Sydney with a B.A. in Visual Arts and tutors a Bexley Art Group. She has won many major awards and has had a number of solo exhibitions. She is proficient with eco prints, collages using natural pigments, drawing and painting but always reveals a relationship & response to the Australian landscape. Charlie says: "My art has a connection with nature but it is not a copy of it but remembers colours and shapes."

About "Looking Through" (at right), she says: "My paintings are an emotional response to the outback and the bushland around me ... brightly, flickering light changes ... making endless different shapes and colours, with the tree trunks and leaves."

Charlie won the Masterton Homes Prize in this year's Annual Exhibition and the judge, Paul Howard, said of her work: "(It) has a sense of place and highly developed visual language that captures the memory and experience of place..." She also won the LAS Scholarship in 2020.

**LIFE MEMBERSHIP** was granted to John Tregoning for his considerable service to LAS over the last ten years, including his term as President.



**Yayoi Kusama's** exhibition at the National Gallery of Victoria (NGV) was the most visited exhibition in Australian history. It was the largest exhibition ever dedicated to a single living artist, occupying the entire ground floor and spilling out onto the street. This exhibition celebrated the almost nine-decade career of the 96 year old Japanese artist. In 2023 & 2024 Kusama had the highest auction sales made by any contemporary artist in the world. AGNSW has one of Kusama"s sculptures displayed on the terrace of the new, North building, Naala Badu.

#### JULY DEMONSTRATION REPORT

There has been a marked increase in numbers attending demonstrations since changing the venue to the Powerhouse. Hopefully this is providing easier access for some members. – Di Hallinan

"On Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> July, 30 LAS members, joined Paul McCathy in the Clayhouse, for an enjoyable demonstration of 'pastels', one of the mediums he has worked with for over 30 years. Paul prefers to create plein air, but for demonstrations uses a black and white image for tonal values, and a colour image as a guide to his completed 'loose style'.

Paul uses mainly the French, 'Sennelier' Soft Pastels, and some of the English, 'Unison', brand which he purchases from Soft Pastels in Adamstown, a suburb of Newcastle. He creates on a 'hot press' pastel paper, but also uses Matisse 'high tooth gesso' to provide the key for his 'drawing'. As an alternative – Mi-Teintes 'Touch' or 'Plastermat' products.

He rarely seals the finished work, which remain vulnerable to 'the touch', and suggests the use of a 'resin in alcohol' product for those occasions when protection is desirable – Windsor & Newton – Professional, 'fixative' brand. Most of Pauls 'tools of trade' look to be available from Soft Pastels, some from Art Sup in Kingswood.

#### Some key pointers -

- You can't 'mix' pastel colours, so your library of pastel stick colours can be extensive
- Paul tends to draw with the stick, rarely uses the side of the stick (to cover large areas)
- He works on a coloured paper (purchased or acrylic paint to tint gesso)
- Works dark to light difficult to get suitable darks, consider using charcoal as an alternative
- Tonal value is more critical than colour
- As with all mediums distant elements are 'faded' and bluer than closer elements
- He doesn't 'draw hard edges to elements', uses colour and tonal values for the 'eye' to form.
- The direction of a 'line' will indicate to the 'eye' a dip or slope, grass like elements
- One of the 'dark', 'light', midtones' should be dominant to provide focus in the composition.

Paul emphases that after all these years he is still learning and experimenting with his art journey. Thank you for an enjoyable, illuminating demonstration, an introduction for many, to pastels."

Idil Abdullahi, winner of this year's exhibition, is a Somali-born refugee who graduated from UNSW, majoring in Ceramics. She curated the *African Diaspora* exhibition for Cumberland Council. Her work was selected for the *No Added Sugar* exhibition at Casula Powerhouse in 2012 and she received the Strathnairn Artist in residency grant in 2015. Currently, her work features in the *Kerameikos* exhibition at the Chau Chak Wing Museum at the University of Sydney.

Idil is a community arts & cultural worker who utilizes the creative arts as tool for building stronger communities.





Daniel Lopez Lomeli, born in Mexico City & last year's Scholarship winner. He has this year's Solo Exhibition. Daniel says "I like to use discarded materials, breathing new life into the objects and resources society deems as waste." Drawing from the Japanese concept of Kodama, Daniel expands the idea to include plastic. He collects discarded polymers and transforms them into something organic and dynamic. His asymmetrical sculptures celebrate imperfection as a form of equilibrium.
