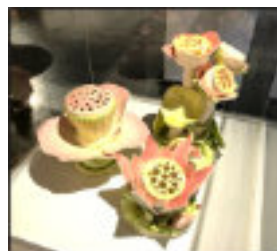

Well, we're back in 'party' mode!

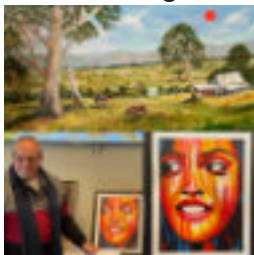
All who attended the ARTy pARTy at Cabramatta Bowling Club had a great time and absolutely loved the venue, food and especially the company.

## Demonstration with Yolanda Seach.

Yolanda began drawing and painting in her childhood and has continued her artistic work since. After graduating with a Bachelor of Adult Education Degree (UWS) in 2000 she took up painting more seriously improving on her traditional oils and watercolour, extending to acrylic and mixed media. She has embraced a wide range of styles and subject matter, from technically accurate trains to humorous works in mixed media and naïve works, from traditional landscapes to contemporary florals, subtle watercolours to acrylics with impact.

In 2003 Yolanda began entering local competitions, has held a solo exhibition at the Old White House in Castle Hill, at Aberdoon House in Rouse Hill and at her home gallery from where she stated teaching. She was the featured artists in the Blacktown Arts centre 'Travelling with Birds' exhibition in 2006, two of her works were published in Issue 81 of Artist's Palette Magazine.

Yolanda has donated over two dozen paintings to various charities and worthy causes, including Cancer Council, Blacktown Hospital, Westmead Children's Hospital, Inner wheel clubs, for their charities, and Rotary.

Yolanda has exhibited in the Archibald Prize and enjoys giving demonstrations to other art societies and watching the development of the friendly mix of young, through to retired people, who love the journey of learning to draw and paint through her teaching.
