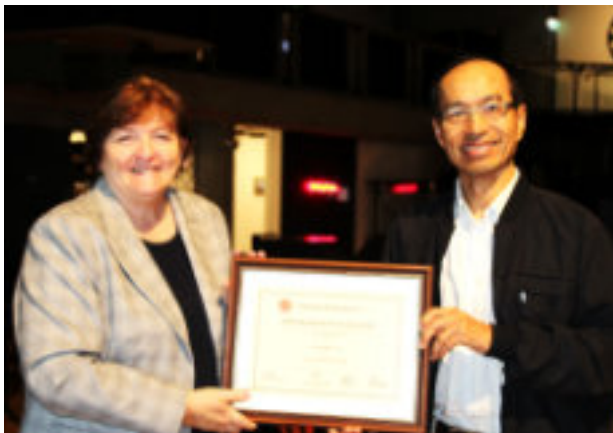

## Reports/Activities

### Rebecca Brady -Oil Based Inks

On Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> June, Rebecca Brady added a 'splash of colour', to a crisp winter 's day, with her distinctive style demonstrating alcohol-based inks.

This medium is much like watercolour – preserving your 'whites', Isopropyl Alcohol replacing water to delete the pure colours, but with the capacity to manipulate this fast-drying medium using a drinking straw to 'blow' your design or a hot air gun to move and dry your creation. By adding more colour, or more strategically placed solvent, the image can be re-activated. For the more adventurous that solvent can be lit creating a whole new world and result – remember to select a safe place for this technique though. Rebecca's tools of trade –

DuraEle, white ELES in a range of sizes from Bunnings. The 'glossy' side of Yupo Synthetic Paper – Art shed, Officeworks, Riot on line.

Alcohol based inks – Pintata, Tim Holtz and others – Officeworks, Craft On-Line, Eckersley's, Riot on line. There are 'starter packs'.

(Note – you can use alcohol-based inks on other non-porous surfaces.)

Isopropyl Alcohol – Diggers brand from Bunnings, bulk from Sydney Solvents.

Heat Gun – on-line suppliers, hair styling heat guns probably not suitable.

Plastic shot glasses – for mixing, or a plastic pallet.

Pipettes – 12 for \$6 from Officeworks or similar cost for 100 on-line.

Plastic drinking straws – could be difficult to find.

#### Some safety notes –

Don't lick your fingers while working with this medium.

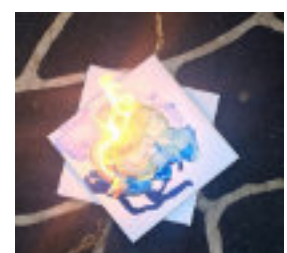
No food or drink while working with this medium.

Need good ventilation.

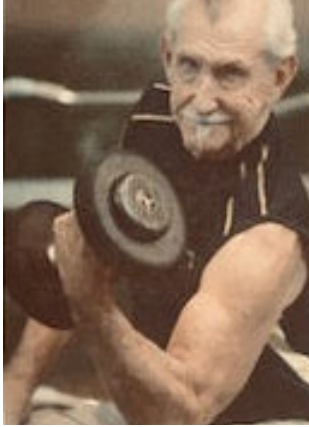
Using a straw – blow not suck.

Burning effect – your PPE, outside, consider work bench and surface under your work, have an extinguishing source handy.

And to fix your masterpiece – leave for 3 or 4 weeks then a suitable spray gloss, resin coating if your creation is to be used as a hot surface. Enjoy By John Tregonning

## President's Report

### NEW LAS PRESIDENT – Chris Hunter

Chris Hunter was officially appointed by the Management Committee to fill the casual vacancy of President, remaining after the AGM.

#### Interview with Di Hallinan.

#### Chris, what would you like to say to members?

I'd like to introduce myself to members I haven't as yet had the pleasure of meeting in person.

My name is Chris Hunter, I'm a practicing artist and volunteer at the Penrith Regional Gallery the Lewers' Bequest. In 2021 I managed to win the Local Artist Award at Fairfield Art Society with a portrait titled 'Call Waiting'. Four of my Collage pieces were recently on exhibition at the Hawkesbury Regional Gallery in an exhibition titled 'We're All Going on a Summer Holiday' which ran from 6 December 2021 – 10 April 2022.

#### When did you become interested in Art?

I always had an interest in art and always wanted to become an artist but raising four daughters as a sole parent, while working full time left little room for much else. I have however always seemed to manage to fit in volunteering, be it at my daughters' pre-school, Primary school and High schools; usually as president of the Parents Committee. Somewhere during those child raising years I was involved with Rotary for six and a half years. I was the first woman president of the Rotary Club of Wetherill Park and the first to run two consecutive years in a row before handing the reigns to a second woman president. As much as I am about empowering women (remember I raised four daughters) I feel I need to state that most of my best friends are men. Moving on... For the last ten years I was the President and Chair of the Body

Corporate Committee of my mother's over 55's Strata Village. I am a glutton for punishment yes.

#### Who are your favourite artists?

Too many to list and always finding new artists to love. A recent favourite, which I had the great pleasure of meeting last year is Jo Bertini. Love her semi abstract desert landscapes. Favourite art movements: beside the wonderful Impressionists, I guess I'm drawn to Pop Art and Semi Abstract works; but I do admire and appreciate the skill needed to producing realistic works.

#### Tell me about your Art practice?

Admittedly I've been involved with photography more than painting this year, but really do need to pick up a brush again. I have a series of four monochrome paintings on the go at present; two in oil and two in acrylic. I have struggled to complete them, again for many personal reasons. Life is challenging and we all go through so much in our personal lives. Liverpool Art Society is, and hopefully will continue to be a great outlet for its members' creative expression and offer opportunities to come together socially with like-minded people; fellow artists.
